NARRATIVE REPORT OF THE WHFP ACTIVITIES

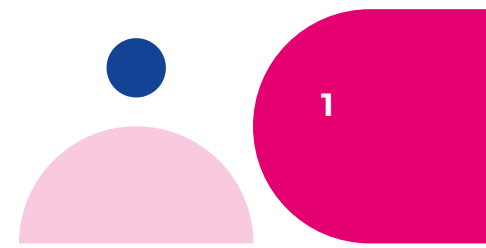
Year 2024

Woman Health & Family Planning Charity Foundation (WHFP)

is an organization that has been consistently and actively working since 1996 in the domain of public, sexual and reproductive health all over Ukraine. The Foundation is also a member of the International Planned Parenthood Federation (IPPF), the European Breast Cancer Coalition (EUROPA DONNA), and the Network for Reproductive Health and Rights in Central and Eastern Europe (ASTRA).

2024 was the third year of Russia's full-scale invasion of Ukraine. Owing to the defenders of the Ukrainian Defense Forces, we were able to continue our work and take care of Ukrainians' health. In 2023, the WHFP collaborated with the following donor and partner organizations: IPPF, UNFPA, CARE and GFA Consulting Group Germany/SDC.

- 1 protection of SRH, including for people with disabilities
- 2 advocacy and awareness-raising in public health
- 3 NCD prevention programs, including cancer prevention
- 4 training for doctors, social workers, teachers etc.
- 5 support of health-care facilities for barrier-free access
- 6 capacity-building of healthcare workers to respond to GBV
- 7 independent expertise
- 8 advocacy at the national level
- 9 rehabilitation programs for cancer patients

Annually, from January 1 to December 31

Project goals

- Updating the visual branding of the Foundation and the website of the organization
- Organization and provision of small grants to NGOs working in the field of sexual and reproductive health

Project results

- 158 trainings on comprehensive sex education for youth and adolescents were conducted
- 2042 participants took part in trainings
- 14 annual concepts of comprehensive sex education programs in youth centers and spaces developed
- 8 additional subgrants for youth centers and spaces
- Social Theater Festival, which was attended by 98 participants from Chernihiv region

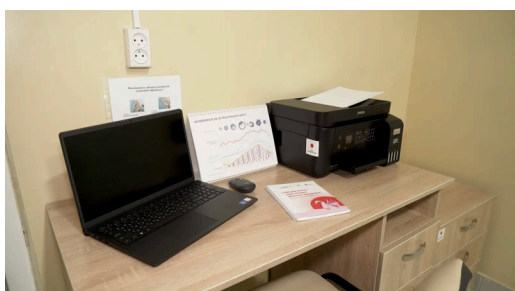
January 01, 2024 - December 31, 2024

Project goals

- Strengthening the capacity of healthcare facilities and medical professionals to provide comprehensive emergency obstetric and gynecological care, as well as other essential sexual and reproductive health services in Dnipro and Zaporizhzhia regions
- Improving access to services and referrals in cases of gender-based violence in Dnipro and Zaporizhzhia regions
- Raising awareness of women and young girls on sexual and reproductive health issues and gender-based violence through the dissemination of printed materials and information via the Internet

Project results

- 65,000 women and girls have received sexual and reproductive health services
- 4 pilot medical facilities provided with medical equipment and medicines
- 5 trainings on the organization of emergency obstetrics and gynecology services were conducted for 136 healthcare workers from the pilot regions
- 4 trainings on first aid for victims of sexual and gender-based violence were conducted for 201 healthcare workers
- more than 3.3 million women and girls of reproductive age were reached through an information campaign on reproductive health

Humanitarian response activities in sexual and reproductive health services of UNFPA, the UN Population Fund in Ukraine

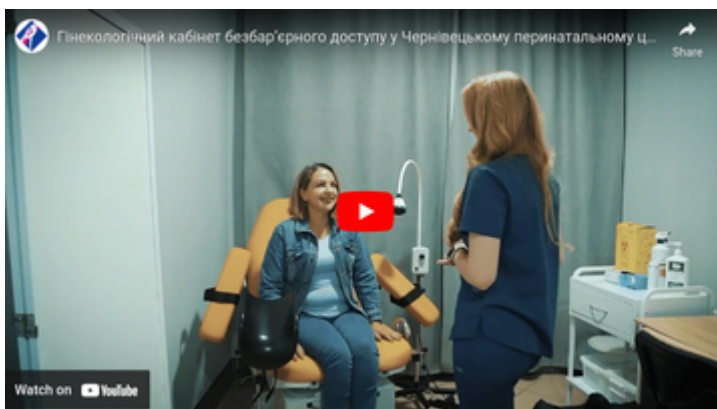
January 01, 2024 - December 31, 2024

Project goals

- Training of healthcare workers in the provision of sexual and reproductive health services to vulnerable groups of women, women with disabilities, women survivors of gender-based violence and internally displaced women
- Advocacy activities aimed at improving the assessment of the quality of sexual and reproductive health services, information and education activities

Project results

- 7 regions: Chernihiv, Cherkasy, Chernivtsi, Ivano-Frankivsk, Ternopil, Donetsk and Khmelnytsky regions
- 15 health care facilities
- 21 trainings on sexual and reproductive health
- 2297 trained healthcare workers
- 12 gynecological rooms with barrier-free access were equipped
- 96396 women received sexual and reproductive health services in barrier-free gynecological rooms

Lifesaving, Gender-Sensitive and Inclusive SRH and GBV Assistance for Conflict-Affected People of All Genders in Ukraine and Poland Project in cooperation with the international humanitarian organization CARE under the support of the German Federal Foreign Office

September 2023 - December 2024

Project goals

- Training of health care workers to provide the Minimum Package of Primary Sexual and Reproductive Health Services, including clinical management of rape
- Equipping health care facilities with equipment and medicines, including kits for safe abortion, clinical rape treatment, childbirth, etc
- Create a chatbot with basic information on sexual and reproductive health and combating gender-based violence, as well as contacts for victims of violence (medical, legal, psychosocial)
- A hotline on sexual and reproductive health and assistance in case of violence to provide consultations, in particular for people in remote areas or in the non-government controlled areas who do not have access to specialized services

Project results

- 2 regions: Dnipropetrovska and Zaporizka oblasts
- 8 healthcare facilities with equipped gynecological rooms with barrier-free access
- 581 healthcare workers successfully trained
- 205 units of equipment and 288 sets of medicines were transferred to medical institutions

August 2024 - December 2024

Project goals

- Training of health care workers to provide the Minimum Package of Primary Sexual and Reproductive Health Services, including clinical management of rape
- Equipping health care facilities with equipment, medicines, including kits for safe abortion, clinical management of rape, childbirth, etc. and condoms

Project results

- 14 medical health care facilities
- 55 health care workers successfully trained
- 40300 condoms were delivered to primary health care facilities
- 5 medical institutions received defibrillators, medical refrigerators, gynecological chairs
- 14 institutions received informational and educational materials on sexual and reproductive health and combating gender-based violence



Meeting the Essential SRH Needs of Communities Affected by the Ukraine Crisis in Ukraine Project under the support of the International Planned Parenthood Federation (IPPF) and the Alliance for Open Society International (AOSI)

Project results

- Coordination of a multidisciplinary working group to develop a sectoral standard of medical care on family planning
- Development of an online course for healthcare professionals on Comprehensive Medical Care for Victims of Gender-Based Violence, including Conflict-Related Sexual Violence in cooperation with the Public Health Center of the Ministry of Health of Ukraine



Vital Assistance in Sexual and Reproductive Health and Protection for Crisis-Affected IDPs and Host Communities in Eastern Ukraine, 2023-2024 project in cooperation with the international humanitarian organization CARE.Ukraine and with financial support from the Government of Canada

April 2023 - June 2024

Project goals

- Conducting a sexual and reproductive health assessment in Ukraine and research on access to services and medicines, namely the capacity of healthcare facilities to provide SRH services, emergency obstetric and gynecological and neonatal care, and comprehensive care in cases of gender-based violence, including clinical treatment in cases of rape, and the need for medicines, medical devices and materials in healthcare facilities.
- Organize training for healthcare workers on the MISP, response to gender-based violence, comprehensive care for unwanted pregnancies and modern contraceptive methods
- Strengthening the capacity of healthcare facilities to provide sexual and reproductive health services by providing gynecological rooms with equipment and medicines

Project results

- 3 regions: Odesa, Kharkiv and Mykolaiv
- 12 health care facilities received support to provide sexual and reproductive health services
- 238 healthcare workers successfully completed trainings
- 8 gynecological rooms were equipped
- 184 units of equipment and 193 sets of medicines were delivered to medical institutions
